4. FIRST AID MEASURES

5. FIRE-FIGHTING MEASURES

Suitable Extinguishing Media:	Carbon dioxide, Foam, Dry chemical
Specific Hazards Arising from the Chemical:	Thermal decomposition can lead to release of irritating and toxic gases and vapors.
